## GHRDC-TRAINING PROGRAM "ROAD TO CORPORATE WORLD"

On October 10th and 11th, 2022, the INDUS BUSINESS ACADEMY in Bengaluru held a two-day student development session. Mekhla Sinha and Neha Kapoor were graciously welcomed by the hosts on the first day with lovely flower bouquets. The Global Human Resource Development Center's executive director is Mekhla Sinha Ma'am, and its human resources manager is Neha Kapoor Ma'am.

The session started with an explanation of hopes and fears, during which the students were asked to write down their top three hopes and worries on a piece of paper. A sheet of paper was then randomly chosen, and the students then discussed how to realize their hopes and face their fears. The following activity involved the well-known game "stupid charades" with a learning twist, in which a select group of students agreed to act out the most important advice on "How to stand out from the crowd" while the others attempted to guess the terms. The students then studied "The Art of Introduction," where they discovered that making an introduction is the key to making a good first impression. Tell Me About Yourself is one of a broader range of questions that can cover a variety of facets of a person's life.

The pupils also discovered how important body language is in conveying one's views to others. Additionally, how both content knowledge and communication abilities are equally valuable. An engaging discussion capped off the first day's program. An interactive Group Discussion round, in which the students were split into groups of ten each, marked the end of the first class day. The students were therefore given a topic for debate, and following its conclusion, they received personalized constructive comments regarding the DOs and DON'Ts of a GD as well as tips on how to stand out among the throng.



## Alumni in Spotlight



1) It's been 5 years since you graduated from IBA. Please tell me about your journey.

It has not been an easy journey I got placed in a real estate company in a sales role but I understood that sales were not for me and at that moment the teaching of my mentor Prof. Chandra Kant sir and the learnings that I got from Prof. Smita ma'am on how to market myself have helped me in shifting my career and moulding it the way I like.

2) Have things changed before and after covid in your perspective?

First of all, I am a lot more confident than I was back then. I am more mature than I was, the way I see and approach things have changed, the way I handle a conversation and I am able to work a lot harder than I used to which has put me out of the the crowd and in the spotlight.

4) What were the greatest learnings in your journey?

I learnt from my failures. I have learnt how to control my emotional self, I have learnt to manage stress. I have learnt that the baggage that you carry is the main reason for your stress, so the best thing to do to maintain a good mental health is either to forgive or to forgo.







5) What generated the passion for going on an entrepreneurial journey?

It could be attributed to my upbringing my family has had a business from my grandfather's time and I got the knack and zeal for entrepreneurship from my childhood.

6) How did you start the incubation for the center's innovative product development?

During my internship, I worked for a networking company and realized the need for innovative products and we came up with the idea of providing the infrastructure to aspiring entrepreneurs for producing and launching their products.

7) As there is a recession looming and a probability of job cuts what is your advice for aspiring entrepreneurs and job seekers?

Even though there is a recession, I personally feel like getting a job is easy but sustaining the job is difficult. Getting into the entrepreneur business before having a robust network makes you dependent on a minimum number of clients. So, I would advise job seekers to go get jobs to prove themselves and then think about their entrepreneurial journey.

8) A word of advice for the 21-23 and 22-24 batches?

I would advise you to be aware of the market trends and base your decisions on these statistics rather than intuition. Invest time in yourself by doing some courses as at the end of the day you have to stand out from the competition and for that to happen you have to constantly upgrade yourself as the world is a lot more dynamic and ever-changing than it ever was.



#### **BOOK REVIEW**




The New York Times best-selling author and social media specialist is back with updated advice on how to use social media marketing to connect with customers and surpass the competition.






### Rethinking Business Studies From Kautilya To Shubhash Sharma

A workshop to celebrate the publication of Chakraborty's Meera book, "Rethinking Business Studies: From Kautilya to Subhash Sharma," was held on December 9th, 2022, at the Indus Academy Bangalore. **Business** in Kumar Giri and Meera Ananta Chakraborty attended the program as guests. A brief idea summary of the book by Shubhash Sharma Sir opened the discussion. The informative discussion was furthered by Meera Chakraborty ma'am, who provided insights about her book and how it will affect readers' perspectives and open a third way of looking at business. She inspired the students' thinking about the Indian Management System and how India doesn't need assistance from western nations and can instead have it by describing the history of Indian the significant heritage and achievements made by our forefathers.

Realizing the genuine worth of India and its assets, however, comes first and foremost. The book was given a fresh perspective by AVR sir's instructive explanation of the book's numerous elements and his own input on the themes. The session was then taken over by Ananta Kumar Giri Sir, who spoke about the book and explained that it is of the utmost importance since it is a place where one may face the world through their thoughts. Increasing challenges and the transition from a finite to an infinite India were discussed as the session came to a close.









## 'Macro-Economic Variables and their interlinkages'

Indus Business Academy Bangalore hosted a guest lecture on "Macro-Economic Variables and their Interlinkages" on November 5, 2022. Mr. Deepak Alva, a current consultant in the field of finance, delivered the speech. With approximately 17 years of experience in various business roles at Asian Paints Ltd., he has over 25 years of corporate experience as a finance and supply chain professional. A "Certified Coach" from Results Coaching in Australia is another position he has held.

The resource person emphasized several macroeconomic ideas and described how the economy benefits from rising GDP. He helped us understand the distinction between a fiscal and trade deficit, where imports (M) exceed exports (x). The resource person went on to discuss how a nation's government's policy choices affect the business or economic cycle, citing four stages of the economic cycle (Recovery Prosperity, Recession & Depression).

Deepak Sir then wrapped off the discussion by using a tale to discuss the experience of a "Hypothetical Kingdom" in relation to macroeconomic factors and how they are interconnected.







#### 'BSE Capital Market Awareness Programme'

The "BSE Capital Market Awareness Programme" was the topic of a guest lecture presented by Indus Business Academy Bangalore. It was Ms. Srikanta Lahari Sagi who spoke. She holds an M. Com, an LLB, an MBA, a B.Sc., and an IIMK certificate in Financial Data Analytics.

In addition to having solid topic knowledge, she also has close to ten years of extensive experience working for top firms across numerous industries in the "Business Industry." In addition to all of this, Ma'am has over ten years of teaching experience and is a specialist in fields including finance, business process analysis, and training & development. Additionally, Ms. Srikanta Lahari Ma'am has published papers in the "International Journal" about "Women Entrepreneurs."

The first part of the program focused on providing knowledge about the "Financial Market" and how it operates in light of the current market conditions. She discussed how picking a good or bad product should be based solely on one's own analysis and not on advice from others. She continued by discussing "Capital Market Awareness," which is crucial for gathering accurate information to evaluate and make wise investment decisions on the BSE, NSE, etc.

The speaker continued the discussion by defining "Transparency," a crucial trading criterion. She also covered the requirements for purchasing and selling shares on the stock market as well as the accounts required to trade on the stock market, including the savings bank account, trading account, and demat account. Subsequently, Ms. Srikanta Lahari Sagi discussed the main points of "Financial Planning" and the financial instruments offered by the BSE, such as equity, derivatives (futures & options), currency, etc. She provided information about "BSE," its website, which is the most popular capital market website, and the many initiatives taken by "BSE" before the session came to an end...







#### "Emotional Well-Being"

Indus Business Academy Bangalore hosted a guest lecture on "Emotional Well-Being" on November 22, 2022. Mrs. Akila Swaminathan, Co-Founder and Director of Core Talent and Leadership Development Pvt. Ltd., spoke at the event. At JSW Steel Ltd., she began her career as an assistant manager. She managed Strategic Analytics Programs in the pre-sales and operations domains while working as a Business Planning Manager at Hewlett-Packard for almost 8.5 years. She is also a Certified Life Coach, with a primary focus on moral leadership, value systems, and emotional equilibrium.

The resource person emphasized the link between emotional and physical health. She continued by remarking, "You are what you believe," emphasizing the impact of one's cognitive process on their sense of individuality. She went on to discuss "UBUNTU" and its four components, which are respect for one another, solidarity, and survival. The resource person also discussed the "Get & Give" philosophy of life, which emphasizes the need for a supportive environment in fostering connections. After then, Speaker Akila Ma'am discussed how "ETHICS" and "EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING" are related. Ma'am discussed the implications that would be more likely to occur if things weren't done in concert with one another. In order to reduce socially awkward behavior, she shared how to grow in life by choosing optimism and forming connections with others.

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
